Trusting the Catcher

Trust is the basis of life. Without trust, no human being can live. Trapeze artists offer a beautiful image of this. Flyers have to trust their catchers. They can do the most spectacular doubles, triples, or quadruples, but what finally makes their performance spectacular are the catchers who are there for them at the right time in the right place.

Much of our lives is flying. It is wonderful to fly in the air free as a bird, but when God isn't there to catch us, all our flying comes to nothing. Let's trust in the Great Catcher.

I was puzzled by the logic of this devotion and found myself asking, "When is God not there to catch us?" "What scriptures are there that could help me or at least remind me of the understanding that there may be times that God will not be there to catch us ... what about the "never leave us or forsake us promise so many cling to?" "Is trusting God the condition for which our Heavenly Father is there ready to catch me when my flying seems out of control and I am about to do a crash landing?"

I was then reminded of a passage from Hebrews 12.

³ For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls. ⁴ You have not yet resisted to bloodshed, striving against sin. ⁵ And you have forgotten the exhortation which speaks to you as to sons:

"My son, do not despise the chastening of the LORD, Nor be discouraged when you are rebuked by Him; ⁶ For whom the LORD loves He chastens, And scourges every son whom He receives."

⁷ If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? ⁸ But if you are without chastening, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate and not sons. ⁹ Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰ For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. ¹¹ Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Sometimes God allows us to fall because He loves us so much that this is the only way He can get our attention. Let's be reminded that God's discipline is out of love for us as His children. Many Christians can quote Romans 8:28, but very few know Romans 8:29 "For whom He foreknew, He also predestined *to be* conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren."

YOUTH MINISTRY

Slowly, we're moving toward RYM @ Colorado! This month and the months ahead, I will send out many updates to keep everyone updated with the latest info, so I apologize ahead of time!

We have a number of events ahead of us just this month alone...

Super Bowl Party

This Sunday, <u>February 5th @ 5PM</u>, the Youth will have their Super Bowl Party in the Youth Room. Each teenager is to bring either an entree or dessert. This is for Grades 7th-12th. And please do let them bring a friend!



Valentine's Day Dinner

Also, on <u>February 11th at 6PM</u>, we will have our annual Valentine's Day Dinner. Youth who plan to attend RYM this year are expected to serve(unless other schedules conflict). A number of the proceeds from this dinner help fund our trip to RYM.

Money for RYM

The initial deposit for RYM to secure your child's spot is \$100 and is due February 8th.

Here's another detail we've added this year: we'll have 4 planned fundraisers in all - see the schedule of those below - and if your teenager can make 3 of the 4, we'll pay the full 50% of the costs. In other words, it's like past trips: we pay 50% (\$205.00) and you pay 50% (\$205.00), but this year, we needed to make sure that the teenagers were helping at as many fundraisers as possible. In the previous year, the last 2 fundraisers had only 5-7 show to help. So, if your youth can make it to 2 of the 4, the church will fund 25% (\$102.50) and you'll pay 75% (\$307.50), and if they show to 1 of the 4, the church will fund 15% (\$61.50) and you'll pay 85% (348.50).

Exceptions

There's always exceptions to attending these fundraisers. I've already been notified that some youth already have plans during some of the planned dates. Please let me know ASAP if your youth cannot attend some of these, and we'll work something out.

Of course, the need does not diminish after December. Donations are taken year round at the church and to the food pantry.
